MAYOR HAUBERT TOUTS DUBLIN'S STRENGTH AT ANNUAL CHAMBER OF COMMERCE STATE OF THE CITY ADDRESS

Mayor David Haubert delivered a rousing speech to a sold-out crowd touting the economic prowess of the City of Dublin and the future of the community at the Annual Dublin Chamber of Commerce State of the City Address.

Citing a combination of statistics and city accomplishments in 2018, Mayor Haubert said that the future of Dublin is bright. Among the city highlights are a major renovation of the Corrie Center in Downtown to be a Class A office complex with a future hotel on the site. Another new Westin Hotel project is in the works for a six-story, 200 room, four-star hotel, located adjacent to the existing Dublin/Pleasanton Bart Station.

West of the Kaiser project on the east side of the city is a 15-acre site which will be the future home of Nissan; “The Glen at Dublin,” which was approved, will be home to the new IKEA store and the site will also include 93,000 square feet of retail and restaurant space; and the new Zeiss Innovation Center is under construction which could accommodate up to 1,500 jobs in their new state of the art Research & Development facility!

For the Downtown, the City Council has made a strategic decision to focus on the downtown area. The City of Dublin created a “Downtown Fund.” Five million has been set aside for strategic investment into Downtown Dublin. Vacancies are low as Light Industrial properties in Dublin have an astounding “one percent” vacancy factor. Haubert ended his presentation stating these successes would not be possible without the assistance of the Dublin Chamber of Commerce.

Thank you Mayor Haubert and the Dublin City Council for being a champion for local business.




MESSAGE FROM CEO – INGE HOUSTON

FIRST KAISER PERMANENTE MULTI-SPECIALTY CARE HUB IN NORTHERN CALIFORNIA SIGNALS NEW ERA IN CARE DELIVERY

New Cancer Care, Urgent Care, Surgery Center and Specialty Offices Address Growing Health Care Needs of Tri-Valley Region New Era in Care Delivery

Dublin, CA, May 11, 2019 – Kaiser Permanente’s first multi-specialty care hub in the region is scheduled to open in Dublin, May 20 and begin serving members in the Tri-Valley area of Alameda County, a major and long-anticipated expansion of health care services that includes cancer care, specialty care, surgery center, and 24-hour urgent care in one of the fastest-growing communities in California. The new campus represents an increasing shift of care from hospitals to outpatient settings, enabled by evolving care practices, rapid recovery science, and innovative technology.

The 226,000-square-foot multi-specialty hub, which includes the Dublin Medical Office, Cancer Center, surgery center, and urgent care, is located at 3100 Dublin Blvd, and will provide services for more than 140,000 Kaiser Permanente members in the Tri-Valley area with room for growth. About 500 employees and physicians will work out of the new offices.

“Kaiser Permanente recognized that there was a need in the Tri-Valley for high-quality, convenient care, available to our members whether they work, live or commute through the area,” said Janet Liang, president, Kaiser Permanente Northern California. “The way we deliver health care is changing, and we are proud to open this state-of-the-art Dublin multi-specialty hub to serve this vibrant, growing community in new ways that benefit patients.”

The shift of care delivery from the hospital to outpatient settings is driven by advances in recovery science, new advanced surgical procedures, and treatment therapies that allow patients to return home the same day as some surgeries are performed. Advances in and innovative uses of technology are also supporting this shift, as phone, telemedicine, online physician visits, and home-based monitoring provide flexibility and ease of access for Kaiser Permanente members and patients.

In addition to specialty care, 24-hour, 7 days a week Urgent Care with 30 treatment rooms with state-of-the-art equipment will serve members of all ages, including children. The

urgent care provides treatment and services as an alternative to more costly emergency rooms, which are designed for immediate life-threatening or critical care situations. An ambulatory surgery center will also be part of the hub, housing six operating room suites available by referral only.

“Kaiser Permanente strives to provide high-quality affordable health care to our members and the communities we serve,” said Kenneth Grullon, MD, physician-in-chief for Kaiser Permanente’s Diablo Area. “Our compassionate and patient-care focused physicians, nurses and care team members are eager to welcome all of our members to this new site.”

ADDITIONAL DETAILS:

■ URGENT CARE

In the case of a recent injury or illness, or other non-emergency medical need, the Urgent Care services at the Kaiser Permanente Dublin Medical Offices and Cancer Center will be available anytime, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week for Kaiser Permanente members.

Centrally located right off I-580 and 2.2 miles from the Dublin BART station, the 12,985 square foot Urgent Care is equipped with 30 state-of-the-art treatment rooms, complete with laboratory services, extensive imaging services, extended pharmacy hours, and onsite physicians to provide care for members, including pediatrics.

Same-day appointments are available, and walk-ins are welcome, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

■ DUBLIN CANCER CENTER

Kaiser Permanente members in the Tri-Valley will now have access to comprehensive, high quality cancer care and preventive screenings closer to home at the new 33,846-square-foot Cancer Center at the Kaiser Permanente Dublin Medical Offices.

The Cancer Center will provide medical oncology, radiation oncology, infusion/chemotherapy, hematology, clinical trials, radiology and imaging services, nutrition, lab, pharmacy, and counseling support, all under one roof in a coordinated care environment. Our skilled and compassionate medical

teams strive to meet the physical, emotional, and spiritual needs of all patients.

The three-story open atrium waiting area provides a calming environment before appointments. The 22 state-of-the-art general infusion stations and two private infusion stations ensure patients are in peaceful surroundings with a multidisciplinary team that works together to provide the most advanced treatments and quality care.

■ COMPREHENSIVE SPECIALTY CARE

The Dublin Medical Offices and Cancer Center supports the care Kaiser Permanente members receive from their primary care physician and is an addition to the existing Kaiser Permanente medical offices in Pleasanton, Livermore, and San Ramon, allowing Tri-Valley residents to access the care they need, when and where it is most convenient to them—whether that is near home, work, or school.

A wide array of specialty services will be offered at the new Dublin Multi-Specialty Hub including ambulatory surgery, breast imaging, cardiology, endocrinology, gastroenterology, general surgery, head and neck surgery, nephrology, neurology, OB/GYN, occupational health, oncology, orthopedics, physical therapy, podiatry, pulmonary studies, a radiation treatment center, rehabilitation services, rheumatology and urology. These are in addition to other features like health education, lab, pharmacy and x-ray.

■ SURGERY CENTER:

Outpatient surgeries at the ambulatory surgery center will primarily include podiatry, orthopedics, breast surgery, and general. Six operating room suites will be housed at the surgery center available by referral only. The operating rooms are just a few steps away from the Post Anesthesia Care Unit which has 29 recovery bays.

Plans for the remainder of the site at the Dublin Multi-Specialty Hub leaves room for further construction and expansion of services, to meet future demand.


